# Mongolia Judicial Reform Program (JRP)

- 5-year National Center for State Courts activity funded by the United States Agency for International Development
- To assist Mongolia in its transition from communism to democracy and a free market economy



# National Legal Center of Mongolia

- National Center for Legal and Judicial Research, Training and Information, (called the National Legal Center or NLC)
- Established by a resolution of the Minister of Justice in September 2002 as the primary organization for professional re-training and continuing professional development for judges, prosecutors, advocates, and legal advisors
- Also has research, library, and public education functions



- One of JRP's principal tasks is to assist in the establishment of NLC by building its capacity so that it can sustain continuing legal education for lawyers and judges after donor support ends
